# **Felton Street to Potrero Road**



## **Highlights**

- Easy, pretty route with quick access for Newbury Park residents
- The Los Robles section is really fun on a mountain bike
- Makes a good, short add-on to a longer route in Pt. Mugu State Park and Rancho Sierra Vista/Satwiwa
- One of the segments of the 2022 Conejo Open Space Challenge (<a href="https://cosf.org/challenge">https://cosf.org/challenge</a>)

## **Description**

This out-and-back route can be started at either end. The trail is always climbing or descending but generally not steep except for a couple of very short spots, one of which is shown in the photos.

## **Key Statistics**

**Popularity:** There's a good chance of encountering other visitors on the trail. **Parking:** Free; on Felton Street just off of Lynn Rd., or the dirt lot on Potrero Rd.

Distance: 2.9 miles out-and-back

**Cumulative Climbing and Descent:** About 700' total.

Tread Surface: Packed dirt singletrack trail.

Hazards: Possibility of small ruts and a slippery thin layer of dust and sand. There are a

couple of short rocky challenges for mountain bikers.

**Connections:** Los Robles Trail to the east and Rosewood Trail; Wendy Connector to Ranch Sierra Vista/Satwiwa trails and Point Mugu State Park.

**Driving Directions to the Felton St. trailhead:** From the 101 Freeway in Thousand Oaks, take the Lynn Road exit and turn south/west onto Lynn Road. Drive 3.2 miles to the stop light on Felton Street where you turn left. The trailhead is 0.1 miles up in the cul-de-sac.



exit at Wendy Drive and turn south (towards the ocean). Drive 3 miles to Potrero Road and turn left. The parking is 0.5 miles up Potrero, on the left.
